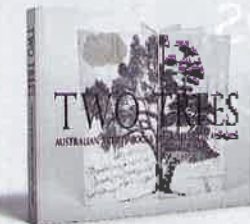


CHRISTMAS ROSE

PechaKucha Night started in 2003 when Astrid Klein and Mark Dytham of Klein Dytham Architects in Tokyo devised the event which lets designers collaborate. Ten years later, it's a global phenomenon and Adelaide has its own regular PechaKucha (Japanese for 'chit chat'). Up to 12 people present a topic of their choice – using 20 images each shown for 20 seconds, which keeps it fast-paced and fun.
