ADELAIDE Zoo's critically endangered Sumatran orang-utan Karta has finally received some good news

Kluet's joyful pregnancy news follows the tragic loss of her stillborn baby infant in January last year.

A post mortem confirmed it died because the umbilical cord was wrapped around its neck

The story made headlines across Australia as mothers grieved with Karta.

Zoo patrons sent sym-pathy cards and toys to both Karta and zoo staff. The 30-year-old orang-

utan has suffered five infant deaths since she was brought to Adelaide Zoo in

1992. Senior primate keeper Jodie Ellen said they were "extremely pleased" Karta had the opportunity to be-come a mum again. "It's something we believe

she greatly deserves," she said.

"Nothing is being taken for granted and we're hop-ing this time around Mother Nature will give us a chance to put our supplementary feeding program into prac-

tice and give her every chance of a successful outcome."

For many years it was not known why each infant passed away shortly after birth and Karta was thought

birth and karta was thought to be inexperienced or even a bad mother. However, in 2011 the Adelaide Zoo primate de-partment discovered she was having difficulty was having breastfeeding.
