Curtain raised on new cinema

AN \$18 MILLION cinema complex planned for Prospect will bring a Rundle St feel to Prospect Rd, the developer says.

veloper says.

Developer Steve Maras, from the Maras Group, submitted plans for the four-sto-rey, art-deco cinema, at the corner of Prospect Rd and Rose St, to Prospect Council late last month.

If approved by the Development Assessment Panel at its August meeting, work would start by the end of the year. Mr Maras said the complex would "bring a bit of Rundle St to Prospect Rd".

"This can be the anchor for the whole street and attract people and other businesses to the area."

Mr Maras did not know how many screens would be built but said there would be smaller "theatrettes".

He said work on the complex, to include restaurants, offices, fashion boutiques and the cinema, would create 110 casual and full-time jobs when it opened in early 2016
