The Maras Group and a group of Chelsea Cinema supporters, known as the Save the Chelsea Action Group, are understood to be the only bid-ders for the Kensington Rd cinema, which Burns de Coun cil has controversially decided to sell.

As of the City North Messen ger deadline last Friday (August 27), the Chelsea had not been sold, although a decision was expected within the next

The Maras Group, which owns land at the southern end of Prospect Rd, on the corner of Rose St and also Labrina Ave, hopes to partner Pulace Nova on the Prospect and Chelsea cinema projecta.

"If the Maras Group are the successful purchasers of Chelsea site with Palace Nova as chief cinema operator there is more of a chance, we would see the circemas come to Prospect Rd," Mr Maras said.

The Maras Group first mooted the idea for the Prosentertainment complex last year, but is yet to put plans to the council
